# SNOWBIRD SEASON SIMPLIFIED: YOUR STEP-BY-STEP

YOUR STEP-BY-STEP TIMELINE FOR U.S. STAYS



## 1. PRE-DEPARTURE (CANADA)

#### Prepare for your U.S. snowbird adventure:

- Make sure your Canadian passport is valid for your entire trip.
- Gather proof of Canadian residence (home ownership, lease, utility bills).
  Plan your return or onward travel.
- Bring evidence of sufficient funds and U.S. accommodation details.

## 2. ENTRY TO THE U.S.

#### At the border:

- Explain your purpose (tourism, wintering, visiting family) and know your destination's address.
- State your intended length of stay (up to 6 months is typical).
- Show ties to Canada if asked.
- The CBP officer decides your stay length. Check your entry stamp or I-94 record.

## 3. DURING STAY IN THE U.S.

#### Enjoy your visit, within the rules:

- Allowed: Tourism, recreation, visiting friends/family, short courses, medical treatment.
- Not allowed: Employment, work, running a U.S. business, remote work for a U.S. company.
- New for 2025: If staying over 30 days, register with USCIS (unless you have an I-94 or NEXÚS). File form G-325R.

## 4. APPROACHING END OF AUTHORIZED STAY

#### As your stay nears its end:

- Leave the U.S. before your authorized date.
- Or, apply for an extension (Form I-539) at least 45 days before expiration.
- Overstaying, even by one day, can lead to bans and future travel issues.

## 5. RE-ENTRY TO THE U.S.

### Returning for another visit:

- Leaving early and coming back for a short stay may be possible.
- Frequent or back-to-back long stays may raise questions at the border.

## **6. COMMON PITFALLS**

### Avoid these mistakes:

- Overestimating your rights as a Canadian visitor.
- Ignoring the new 30-day registration rule.
- Arriving at the border without documentation.
- Carrying prohibited items (cannabis, firearms, etc.).
- Misunderstanding "temporary intent."
- Overstaying your authorized period.
